## From the Principal

Kia ora koutou,

Monday we can return to some normality by opening school albeit with some new rules to keep everyone safe. I want to reassure you all that Forest Lake School is a safe place for students as long as everyone follows the principles that guide what level 2 looks like:

- handwashing and sanitizing
- social distancing, in particular between adults and
- contact tracing.

While some families have chosen not to start their children on Monday, you can still start them at a time during level 2 when you feel confident to do so.

We are also reflecting on what we have learned through distance learning and how this could change how we work as a school in the future. What did we learn about our children that we didn't know before? Were there new skills and knowledge that our children learned through distance learning? What did you as parents learn by working alongside your children?

We will be asking everyone involved in participating in and supporting our students during distance learning, to reflect on the experience and are there lessons we can learn about how children may learn in the future and how we as parents and teachers can support that learning.

Covid 19 has had a huge impact on everyone's lives whether it be the loss of a job, unemployment, loss of a loved one or hardship. If you think we can help or find help for you please talk to us. One of the positives that has come out of this experience for me has been the relationship building with whānau. I want to nurture and strengthen this as we move forward.

While we test our processes this week for social distancing and contact tracing we are trialing no school bells. Still meeting Ministry expectations for the time a school must be open, what a day looks like is being handed back to the teachers and students to manage.

Just a reminder that on Monday no parents are able to come on site. Teachers will be in the school grounds to welcome the students back. We will be practising virtual hugs.

# Things to Know

Thank you to those parents / caregivers that were quick to respond to the survey around your children not returning under level 2 conditions. For those that have not yet responded and intend to keep your children home, please go to the message on the School App sent out 11 May titled "Distance Learning Update Number 9 and Students Not Returning under Level 2 Survey" or find the post on our Facebook page and complete it by 12 Noon tomorrow (Thursday, 14 May). It will be presumed that those that do not respond will be present at school on Monday (18 May). Please refer to the above mentioned School App message and Facebook post to read the new regulations around dropping off and picking up students, in particular the times to drop off and collect students.

We will have uniform sales available at the office, under strict guidelines. These are:

- No cash sales . Eft-pos or bank deposit sales only (uniform can not be given until bank deposit shows in our account)
- Only one parent and one student are to be in the office at a time.
- Students CAN NOT try on clothing. We can show you a sample of what the sizes look like and you can make your choice from these.
- Be aware that we can not exchange these for another size afterward in any circumstance. What you purchase is what you keep.

For those students that borrowed school devices and are returning on Monday, please ensure these are in a paper or plastic bag with your name on and present these to the teacher in class. They will be cleaned before being made available for use in the rooms.
