WHAT IS A PEPEHA?

A papeha is a way to introduce yourself, it tells other people who you are and where you come from A pepeha can be written, but usually, you will stand up and say your pepeha in front of everyone at a formal occasion. A pepeha includes names, places, and events that explain where you are from, which family you belong to, and where you are from, which family you belong to, and where you fit within your larger family.

* A formal accession could be a school assembly or a time when visitors are entiring from another action!



School Lunches Programme

The school will be taking part in the Government Funded School Lunches Programme. The programme starts the first day back of Term 2 (3 May). You will not need to send your children to school with lunch, but they will still require a drink bottle and a snack each day. As part of this programme we have sent home a form asking you to record your childrens dietry requirements (e.g any allergies etc). Thank you to those parents that have returned these promptly. For those that we have not received forms from, your children have been given another to take home. We also have forms available at the school office if you want to complete it here. Please complete the form even if your children have no dietry requirements by writing none and returning it to school.

For those that do not return completed forms, it will be presumed that you do not wish your children to participate in the programme meaning they will not receive free school lunches and you will still need to provide not only a snack, and drink but a lunch as well.

We are working with the Libelle Group who will be providing the lunches each day. While all the food safety protocols are followed, please note that there may still be traces of food contamination as all food is prepared in the one kitchen and in some instances food is sourced from an outside agency.
